SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

4.1. General First Aid Information

4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

4.3. Medical Attention or Special Treatment Needed

Give artificial respiration if necessary. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Do not give mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. Call a physician immediately. Acetonitrile can cause fatal cyanide poisoning. Available Cyanide antidotes are Hydroxocobalamin, Sodium Nitrite and Sodium Thiosulfate administered via intravenous (IV) infusion by qualified healthcare professionals. Wash areas of contact with soap and water for at least 15 minutes. Call a physician if irritation develops. Dilute immediately with water or milk. Induce vomiting. Call a physician.
