4.1. General First Aid Information

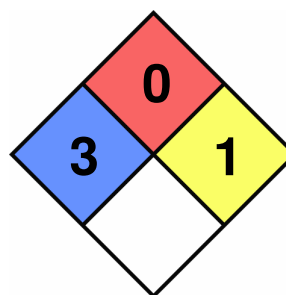
